Arabic Foundations for Medical Students and Professionals

Course aims

The aim of this course is to provide you with a foundation in Arabic, with a focus on medical topics. You will develop listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills in Arabic for understanding basic information and communicating effectively in everyday situations. The course will also help you use Arabic to reinforce your knowledge of other disciplines and enhance your academic and personal growth. Additionally, you will gain insights into the cultural background of the Arab world, with an emphasis on the medical context, and develop greater intercultural proficiency.

Who the course is for

- Undergraduate and Postgraduate students & Researchers in BSMS
- Medical professionals incl. Doctors, Pharmacists, Nurses

Language requirement

No prior knowledge of Arabic language is required.

Contact hours

1.5 hours / week for 10 weeks. Students are expected to attend all classes and to spend approx. 8-10 hours per week in self-study, including homework, speaking practice, and interactive exercises. Some formative assessments will take place in class.

Teaching methods

This course emphasises real-life professional communication scenarios and the practical use of formal Arabic, particularly within a medical context.

Examples of Activities:

- Role-playing medical workplace conversations
- Practising dialogues in pairs to enhance conversational skills
- Learning grammatical structures and vocabulary tailored for professional medical communication
- Pair and group discussions to practise phrases and vocabulary
- Listening to workplace-related dialogues for improved comprehension
